Jungles are tropical, overgrown areas of the world covered in plants and trees. They are also home to many strange and exotic creatures!

There are more kinds of birds living in jungles than anywhere else in the world. This toucan feeds on flowers and nuts, but some birds eat bats and even small monkeys!




Jungle

Beetles are the largest group of insects. There are at least 400,000 different species living in jungles!



Leaf-cutter ants use their sharp jaws to chew through plants.







Tigers hunt alone by **hiding** in bushes and long grass. They carefully stalk their prey **before pouncing!**



Snakes use the **colour of their skin** to hide in the jungle and sneak up on prey. They are also **very poisonous!**

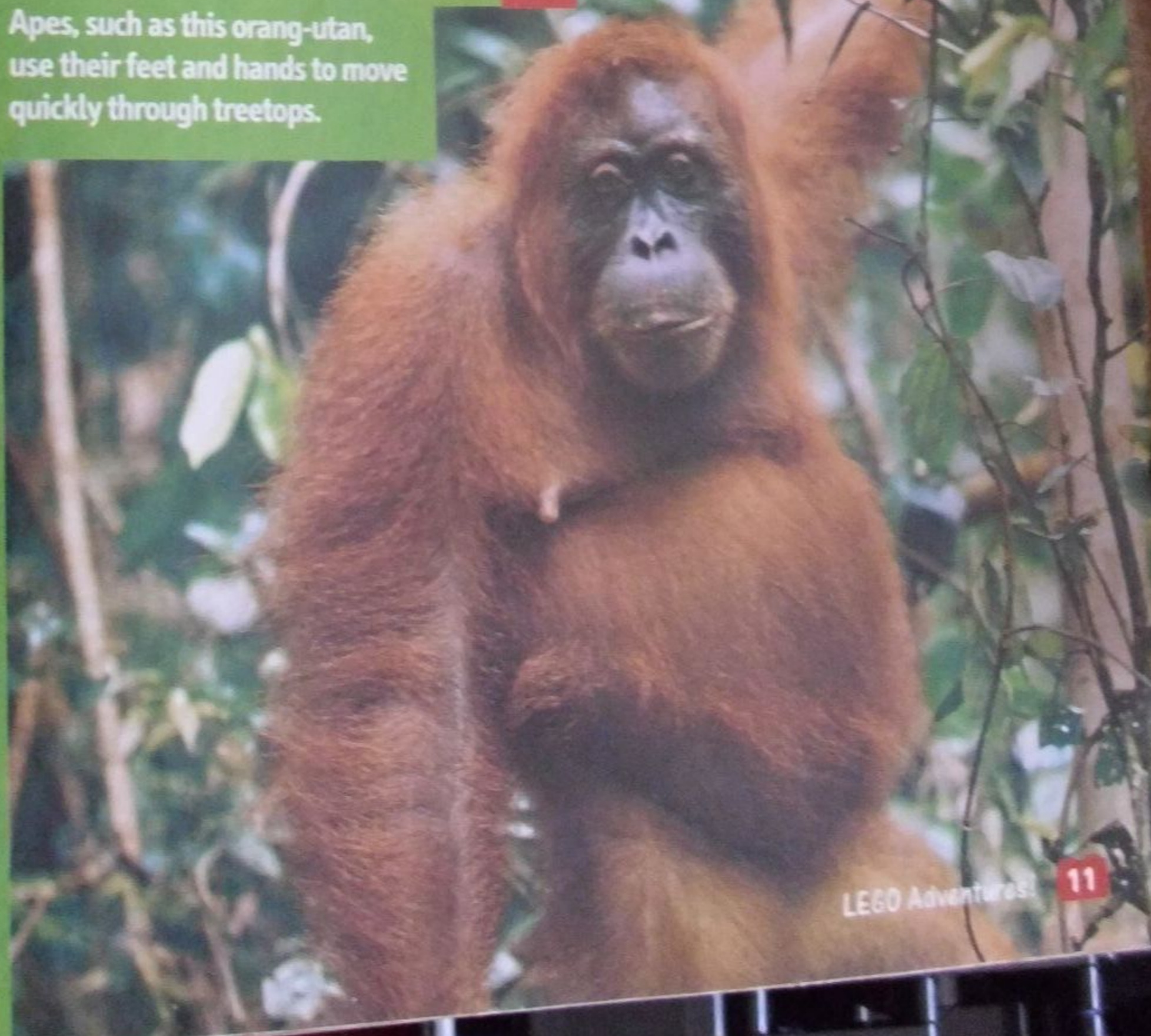


Orang-utans and monkeys are good tree climbers!



Apes, such as this orang-utan, use their feet and hands to move quickly through treetops.

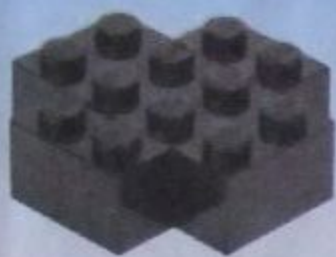
Spiders are not insects. They belong to a group of creatures called arachnids (a-rak-nids).



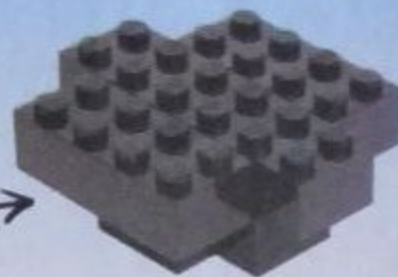

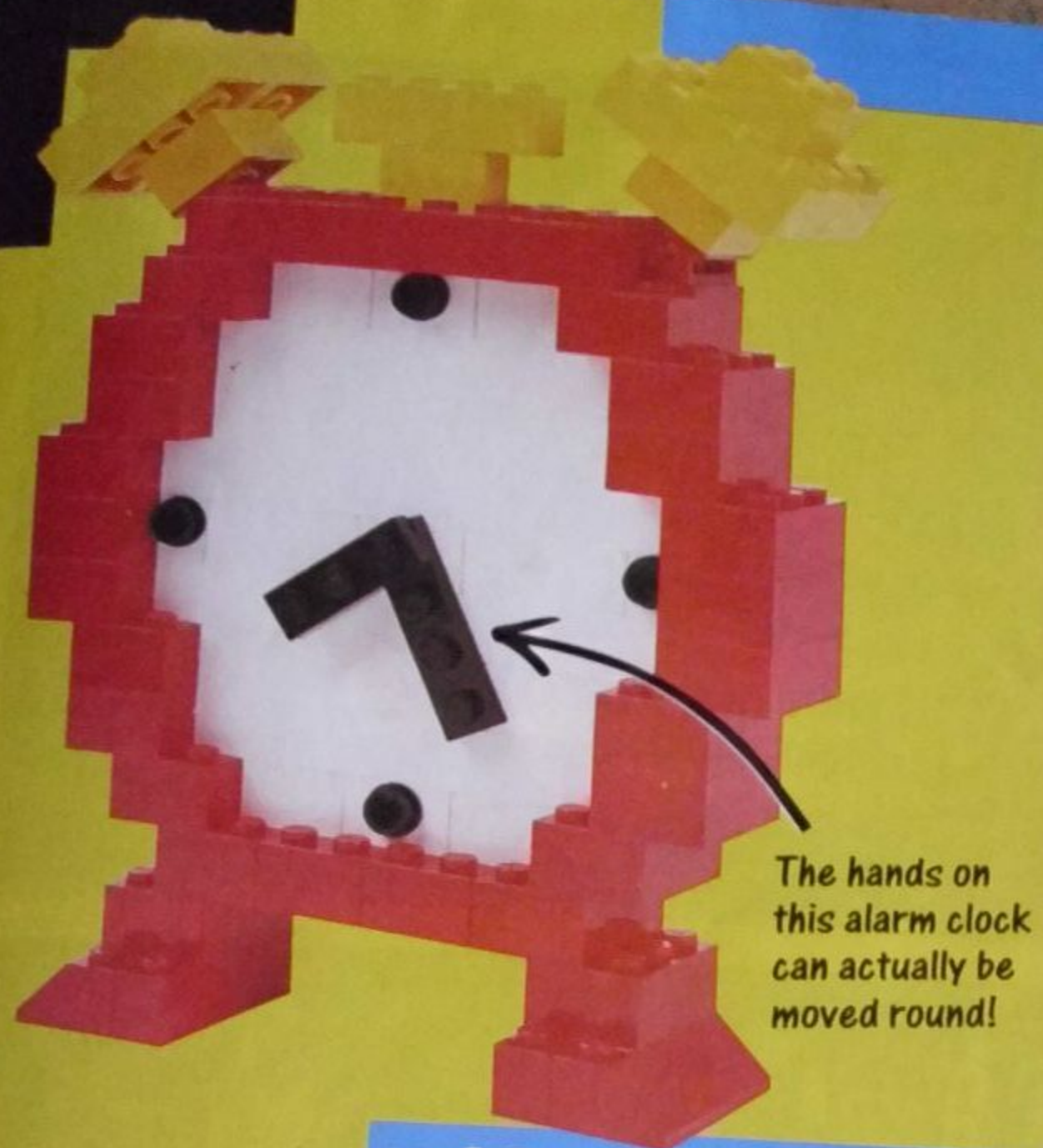

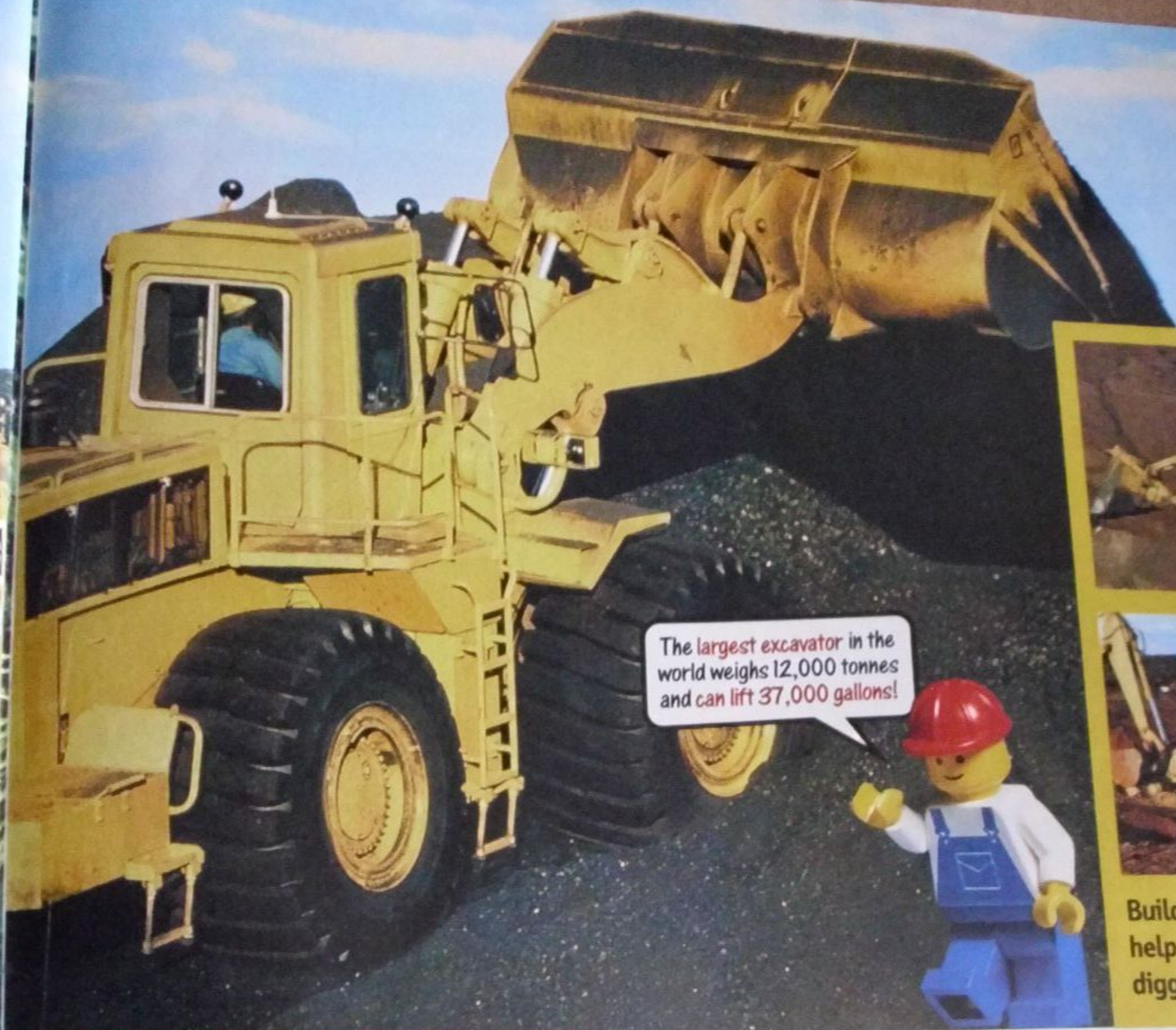
Construction machines are used wherever building work is being done. They can do many difficult jobs from digging tunnels to pulling down buildings!

Building sites can be dangerous places so workmen wear special safety gear, such as hardhats and tough boots. Construction vehicles have specially protected cabs for drivers!

Construction

Bulldozers are used to lift and push heavy rubble. The front bucket is hinged, allowing it to move up and down.





The largest excavator in the world weighs 12,000 tonnes and can lift 37,000 gallons!



Builders use all sorts of vehicles to help with construction including, diggers, cranes and excavators.

Tall cranes are built in stages. They have heavy weights to stop them falling over!



Dumper trucks are used to transport rubble, such as bricks and earth, away from building sites.



Dumper trucks can hold many tonnes of rubble!

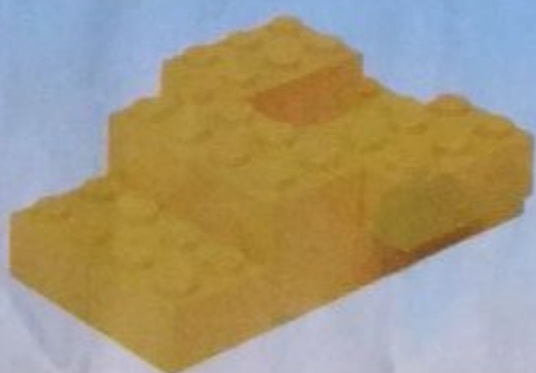

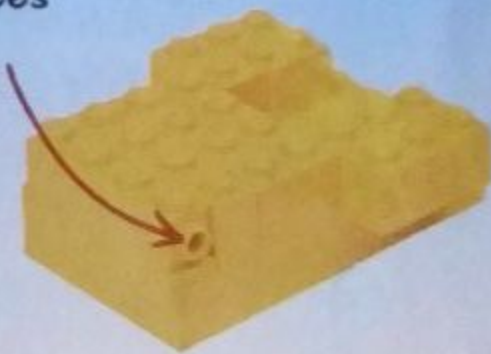

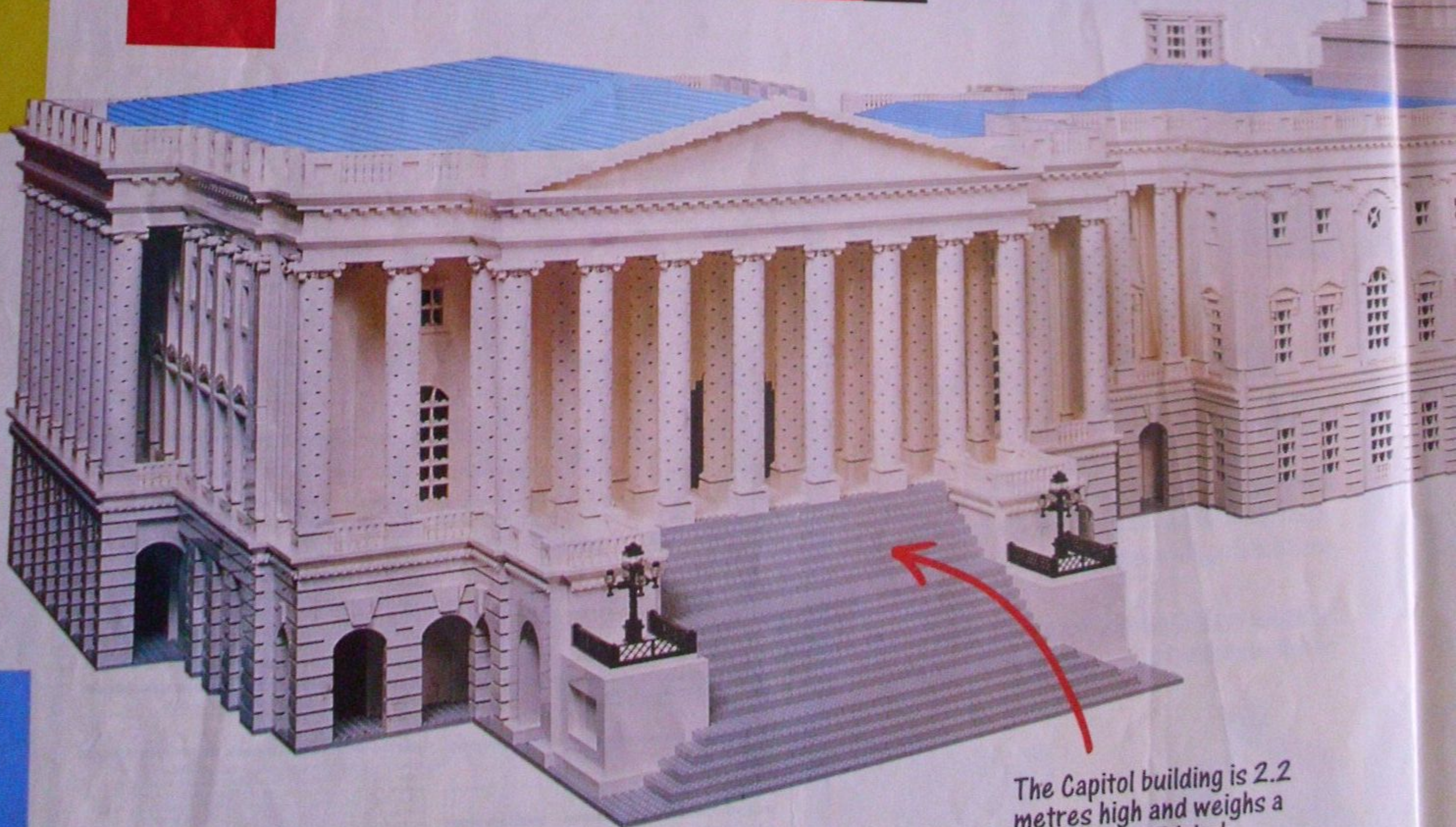
Expert Fact!



One of the new Miniland attractions at LEGOLAND California is the Capitol building in Washington DC, USA. This model contains 1,641,000 LEGO bricks and took more than 1,200 hours to build!

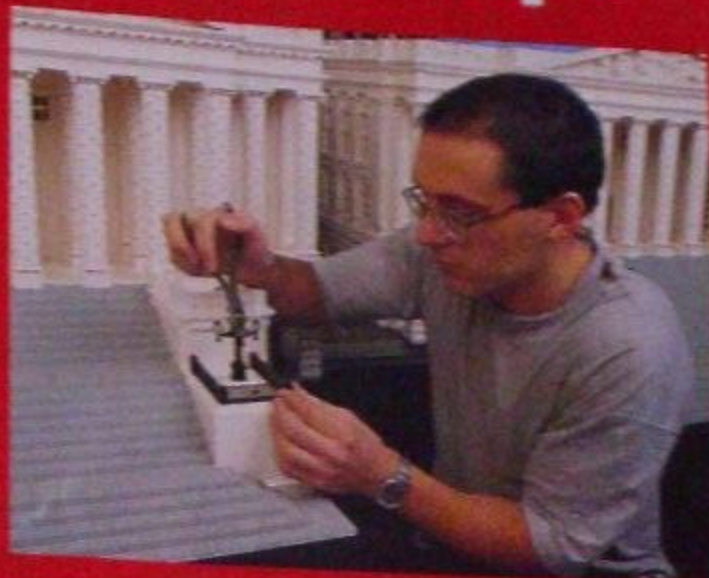
"This great LEGOLAND model actually has a secret hidden feature. Inside is a special tank which pumps water to a nearby fountain!"

The Capitol building's huge dome took more than a week to construct! The statue on top is called "Freedom".



The Capitol building is 2.2 metres high and weighs a staggering 326 kg!

Expert Tip!



"LEGOLAND model makers use photographs of actual famous buildings when constructing a model. Attention to detail is very important and it's the finishing touches, such as working street lights, that make all the difference!"

The model contains four loud speakers. There are also buttons for children to press and each one plays a different tune!

No building in Washington DC may be built higher than the Capitol building's dome!

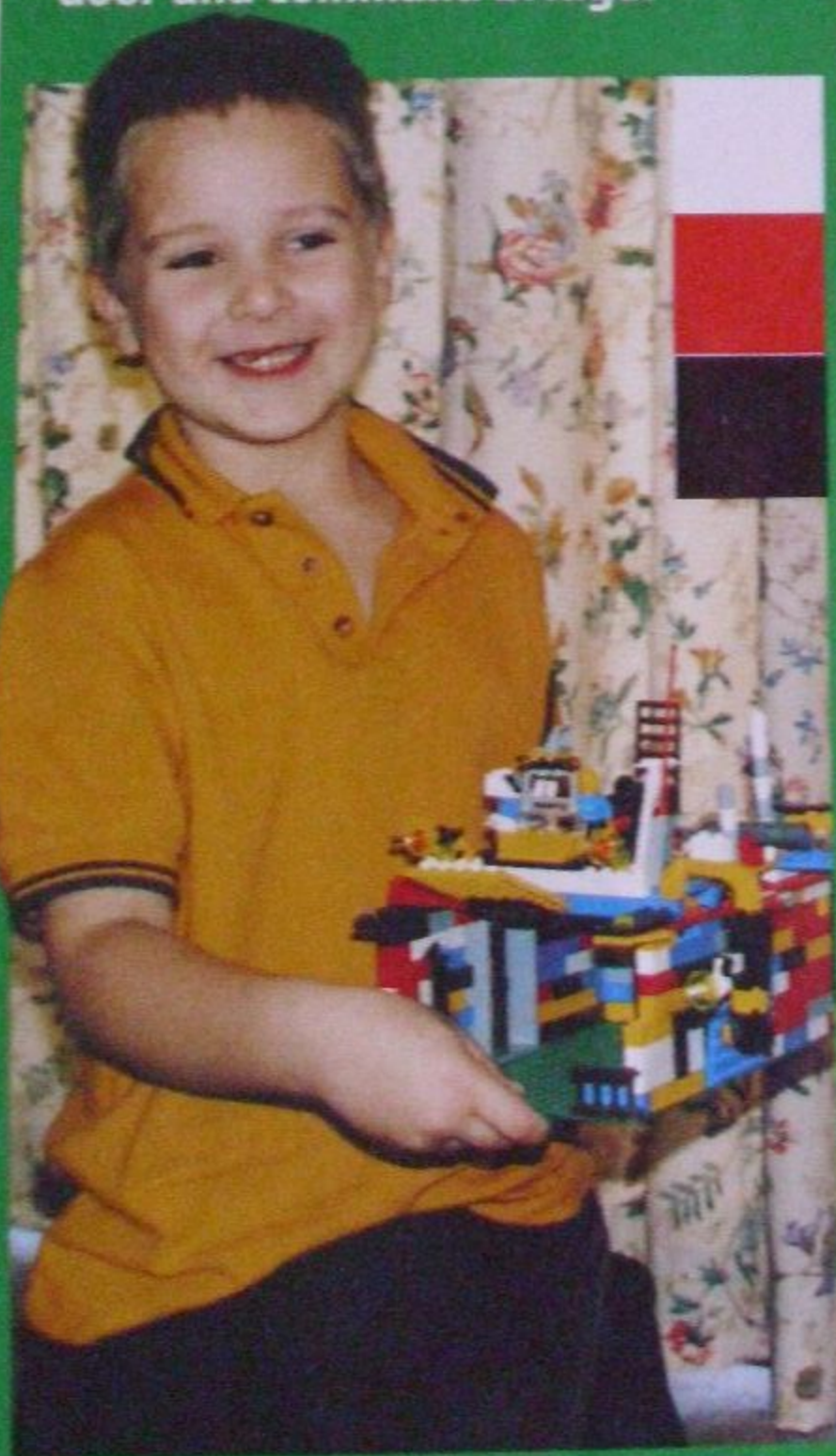
